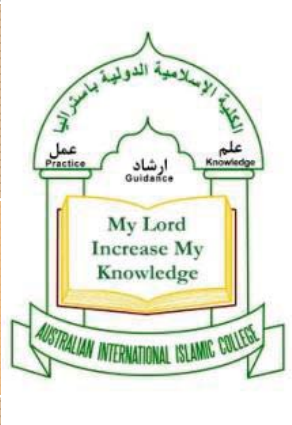

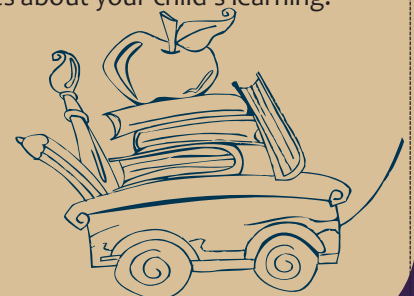


Student of the Month is awarded to Serife Bildiren for being kind and considerate to others and always willing to give a helping hand.

YEAR 3

Dear Parents and caregivers,

We are now half way through our first term and working very hard in all areas of the curriculum. It has taken a few weeks to get into the routine of year three and to adapt to the work and behaviour expectations of 2014 but we are almost there! Check out the pictures of our knowledgeable owls and their self-portraits.



In mathematics we have been covering numbers to 10,000 with a focus on place value, odd and even numbers, regrouping numbers and writing numbers in many different ways.

Geography is a subject that we spend one to two lessons per week on and this term we are leaning all of the state names and capital cities of each state and territory. We will move onto all of the natural features of Australia this week and start researching some of the most interesting parts.

Science is going very well and we are learning how matter can change state from liquid to solid to gas. We are also learning that some matter cannot be changed back once it has been changed from one state to another.

Our English literacy work is focussing on getting our reading levels up up up! As a general guide at the end of year two students should be reading at a level 25 or higher in order to cope with the reading requirements of year three text books. Students are encouraged to log in at home each night and at weekends to finish all 120 lessons and reach the Reading Eggspress stage, which caters for reading levels of 25 and over.



Underneath our Studyladder wall of fame is our sight word chart. This chart shows the Magic 100 Words which make up half of all reading and writing in the English language. They are very important to memorise as many of them cannot be spelled phonetically and just need to be learned. If your child is receiving the spelling words on an A4 sheet of paper, these are the Magic Words and I appreciate all help from home getting each student in our class to be able to read and spell each of these important words.



I look forward to meeting up with those who couldn't attend our information night soon and we can meet up towards the end of term at the parent teacher evening to discuss your child's progress.

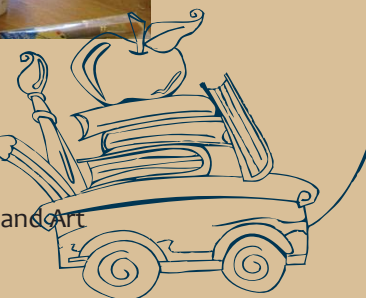


Students of the month – Mohamed Muaz for Years 7/8 and Samih Close for Years 9/10

Prohibition of oppression

Abu Dharr Al-Ghifari reported: Among the sayings of the Messenger of Allah, peace and blessings be upon him, that he related from his Lord Almighty is that he said:

O my servants, I have forbidden oppression for myself and have made it forbidden amongst you, so do not oppress one another.

O my servants, all of you are astray except for those I have guided, so seek guidance of me and I shall guide you. O my servants, all of you are hungry except for those I have fed, so seek food of me and I shall feed you.

O my servants, all of you are naked except for those I have clothed, so seek clothing of me and I shall clothe you. O my servants, you sin by night and by day, and I forgive all sins, so seek forgiveness of me and I shall forgive you.

O my servants, you will not attain harming me so as to harm me, and you will not attain benefiting me so as to benefit me. O my servants, were the first of you and the last of you, the human of you and the jinn of you to be as pious as the most pious heart of any one man of you, that would not increase my kingdom in anything.

O my servants, were the and first of you and the last of you, the human of you the jinn of you to be as wicked as the most wicked heart of any one man of you, that would not decrease my kingdom in anything.

O my servants, were the first of you and the last of you, the human of you and the jinn of you to rise up in one place and make a request of me, and were I to give everyone what he requested, that would not decrease what I have, any more than a needle decreases the sea if put into it.



O My servants, it is but your deeds that I reckon up for you and then recompense you for, so let him who finds good praise Allah and let him who finds other than that blames no one but himself.
