It is apparent that if one does not harm others, he will not be harmed in return. Therefore, man should abstain from doing harm to anybody and keep his peace with his fellow human beings.

It is natural that every action has a reaction; an offence to others will result in defense or retaliation. Once the process of retaliation and counter-offence has begun, there is seldom an end to it. So the scope of Laa Dharara wa Laa Dhiraar, no harm and no harming, can surely be applied to international affairs as well.
