



# AUSTRALIAN INTERNATIONAL ISLAMIC COLLEGE

## Written Entry Requirements Policy

1. Australian International Islamic College will consider enrolment applications from students wishing to apply for a Student Visa, subject to compliance with minimum requirements and conditions set by the Australian International Islamic College, and with legislative requirements of the State of Queensland and the Commonwealth of Australia, including any requirements to undertake extra tuition to learn English to meet the English language proficiency standard needed to enter mainstream classes.
2. Applications for enrolment must be made on Enrolment Application – International Students. This must be correctly completed, and must be accompanied by the following documents to support the application:
  - a) Birth Certificate or passport title page;
  - b) School reports for the last two years
  - c) A letter of reference from the student’s school Principal
  - d) Completed Homestay or Boarding Application Form
  - e) Copies of any certificates of public examination (where applicable)
  - f) Results of English Language Test (i.e. IELTS, ISLPR, TOEFL) or their equivalent, administered by an accredited agency, Australian Education Assessment Services.
3. Where the above documents are not in English, certified translations in English are required, with necessary costs to be met by the applicant.
4. An application for enrolment can only be processed when all of the above are in the hands of the Administration Officer.
5. Applications from overseas students are processed according to established policy and procedures, and are dealt with on their merits.
6. Assessment procedures include an evaluation of reports from previous school and of English language proficiency. In cases where report cards are not available or are inconclusive for any reason, the Australian International Islamic College may require relevant testing of the applicant to assess the application.

AIIC requires evidence that the applicant’s academic ability and English proficiency is sufficient to successfully meet the entry and curriculum demands of the intended course. This is a requirement under the 2018 National Code of Practice, Part B Standard 2.

Minimum academic and English language requirements are as follows: IELTS – Level 4

### Academic Requirements

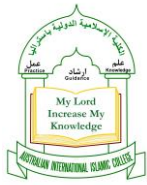
1. Overseas students applying for enrolment at Australian International Islamic College (AIIC) are required to provide the following records:
  - A copy of the latest school report – translated into English
  - A copy of the latest school report – translated into English
  - Copies of any certificates of public examinations (where applicable)

### English Language Proficiency Requirements

An understanding of, and competence in, the use of English is essential to the full achievement of students in the Queensland educational system.

#### **Primary**

**Years 1 – 6**



Students at Years 1 – 6 are assessed individually to determine their learning needs.

**Secondary Junior**

**Years 7 – 9**

Students whose first language is not English must have a Level 4 IELTS with no less than 4 in speaking and listening.

Students wishing to enter AIIC at Years 7 – 9 must have an academic record placing them in the top 50% of their class in Mathematics, Science and English.

**Secondary Senior Years 10 – 12**

For admission to Year 10 students whose first language is not English must have a Level 4 IELTS with no less than 4 in speaking and listening.

Students wishing to enter AIIC at Year 10 – 12 must have an academic record placing them in the top 50% of their class in Mathematics, Science and English.

For admission to Board Subjects (Subjects which lead to University entrance) at year 11 and 12 at AIIC, students whose first language is not English must achieve a minimum Level 5 IELTS with no less than 4 in reading and writing. Where specific subjects have entry requirements, these must be met. admission to Board Subjects (Subjects which lead to University entrance) at Year 11 and 12 at AIIC, students whose first language is not English must achieve a minimum of Level 5 IELTS with no less than 4 in reading and writing. Where specific subjects have entry requirements, these must be met.

Consideration may be given to students who do not meet the English entry requirements on application. Acceptance to Australian International Islamic College will be at the discretion of the Principal.

All students will be re-tested on arrival at Australian International Islamic College.

Please note the following:

1. Students should note that if their language proficiency is below that outlined above, they may be required to undertake an intensive English language course before beginning mainstream studies.
2. Students wishing to enter the Australian International Islamic College below year 10 level are assessed individually based on the contents of their report cards and personal references, and may also be required to undertake a language proficiency test set by the Australian International Islamic College.
