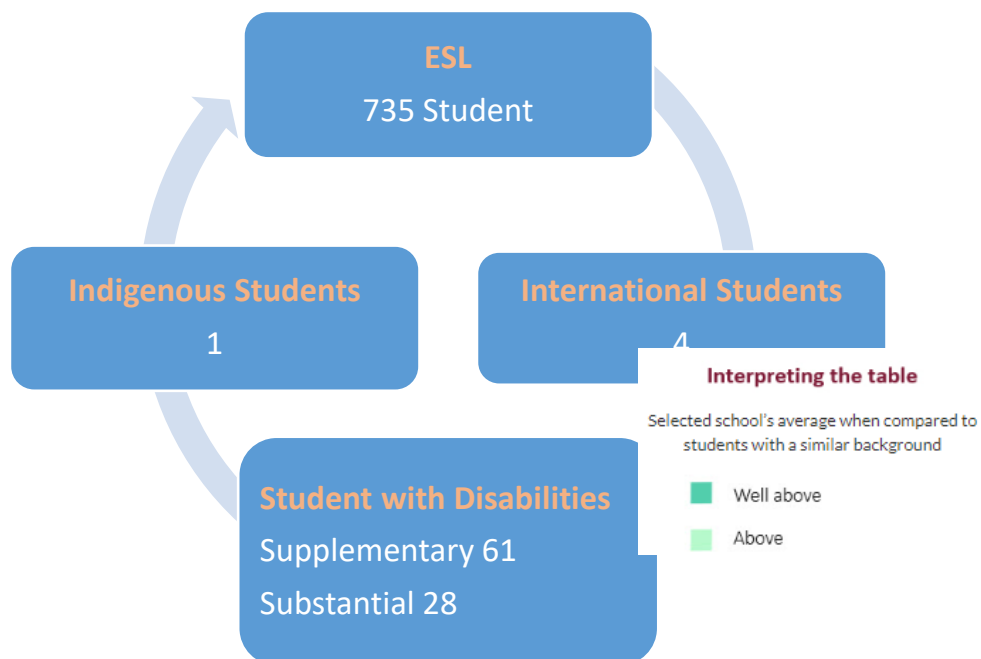

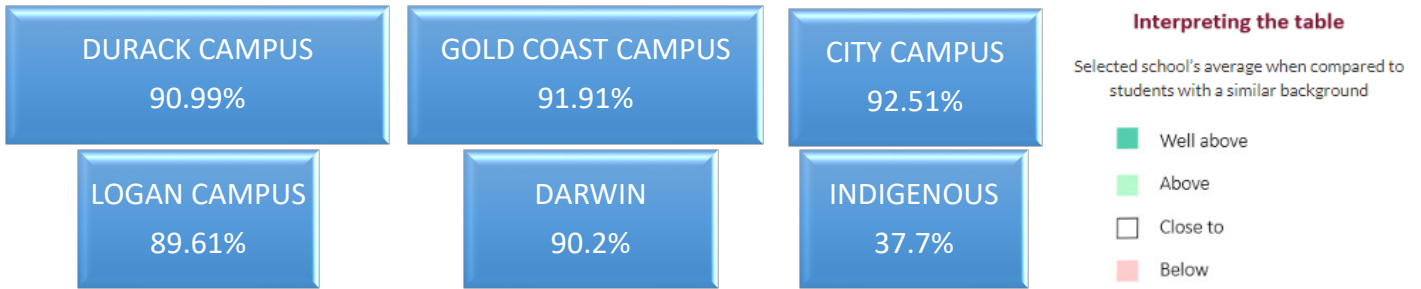

## Student Attendance

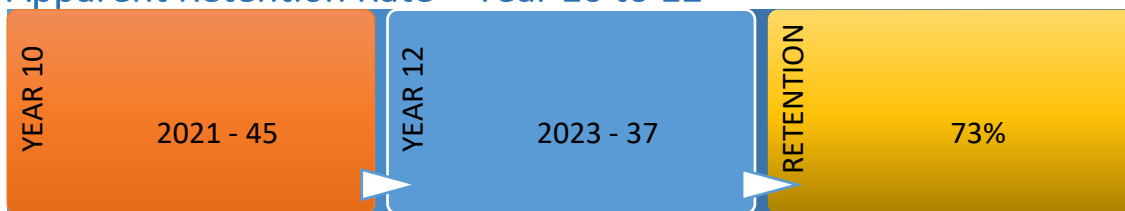

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### Interpreting the Table

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There is no way to sugar-coat the poor performance of AICC students in NAPLAN tests held in 2023. Following are a few possible explanations:

- 1- No one was quite sure if NAPLAN questions were based on last year curriculum or current year curriculum which just has started to be delivered.
- 2- NAPLAN tests were held in term -1 rather than the usual term 2. This change forced us to shift primary students swimming lessons from term -1 to term -2. Students enjoy swimming and outdoors activities, so delaying swimming lessons were not well received by the primary school students.
- 3- Having the NAPLAN tests in Term -1 were unsettling for students, particularly those in lower ability groups as they had just completed the previous year's curriculum and were just beginning to grasp the content of the current year's curriculum.
- 4- AICC introduced the new strategic plan requiring teachers to teach the lower ability students the curriculum from a year earlier. This approach did not adequately prepared them to respond to the NAPLAN questions adversely affecting the overall performance of the group
- 5- Many students speak their own language at home instead of English during Dec/Jan holidays. They hear, speak and write English much less— making them slow to respond to the NAPLAN questions. Very few students revise school learning during the holidays, so they forget work covered in the previous year; this is often called the summer Slide where student go backwards in their learning.

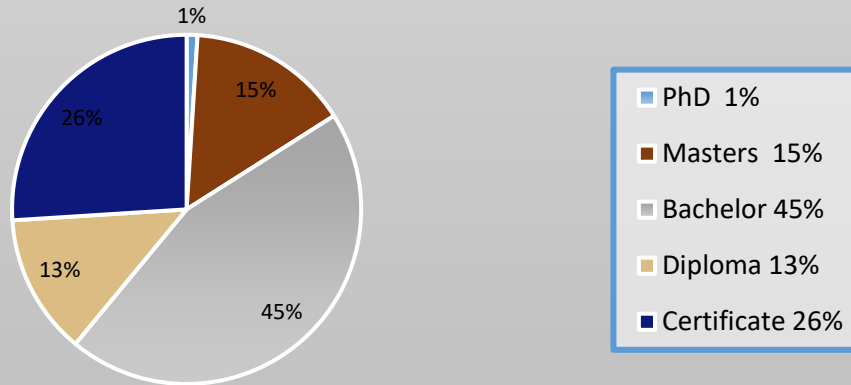

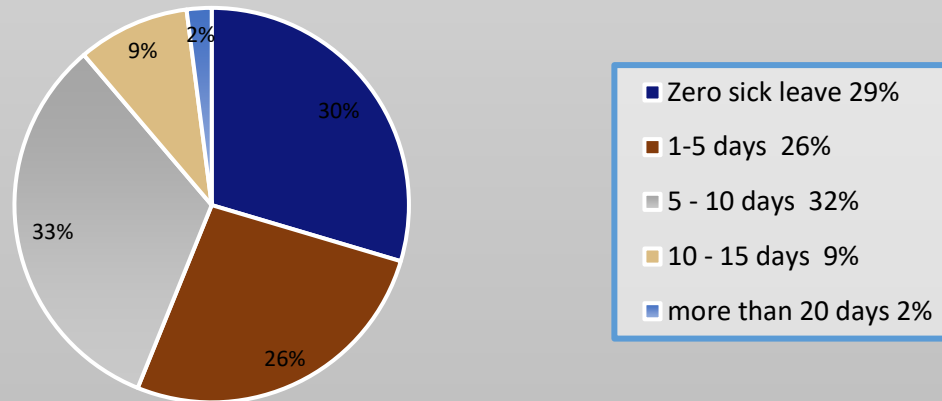

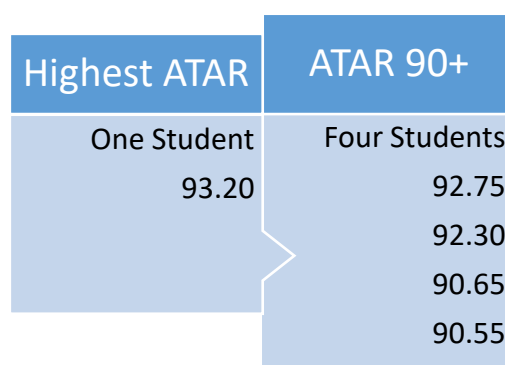
